- Since 2010 I have been working with the estate of author JG Ballard and Ballard's publisher HarperCollins on a wide-ranging, collaborative project encompassing a number of works both by and about Ballard, monographs and collections. The first volume, *Extreme Metaphors*, a compilation of interviews with Ballard, is set for publication by HarperCollins in September 2012.
